American Kestrel

The SWCC outreach program includes classroom presentation about the ecology of the central valley. Our docents will bring up to four native animals into the classroom and talk about their natural history.

We can often tailor the program to focus on habitat, natural selection, predator/prey relationships, or other aspects of environmental education.

We will send you a questionnaire to fill out. Once the talk is scheduled we will send an invoice. Payment may be by check or cash either in advance or at the time of the talk.

There is a \$100.00 fee for each 45 to 60 minute talk. The SWCC is located at 1220 Geer Road in Hughson. Locations more than 25 miles from the SWCC will be charged a \$0.55 per mile mileage fee.

The preferred time to give talks is early afternoon. Talks will not be given before 10:00 am because of the time needed to prepare the animals for transport. No more than two talks can be given in a row.

A very limited number of talks can be given in April and May.
